SOCIO-POLITICAL ACTION

In this edition of l'Entrefilet, we take a look at certain tools used to measure poverty.

Cover one's basic needs

Since 2009, the "Market Basket Measure" (MPC) is used in Quebec as a benchmark to assess poverty from the point of view of covering basic needs. The MPC is calculated by adding up the cost of various needs. Lodging, food, clothing, transportation, other needs and services (i.e. telephone, furniture, hygienic needs, school fees, etc.) Government and social groups agree that, if the yearly revenue of a person does not permit him/her to get the goods and services contained in this basket, this person does not have the basic necessities of life. He finds himself in a situation which affects his health as well as his dignity.

Would you like to situate yourself approximately in relation to the MPC? To start with, calculate your yearly income after having paid your taxes and cashed any government transfers. Then, compare this amount with the one corresponding to your situation in the table below.

Getting out of Poverty

It is possible to cover basic needs, though without being out of poverty. To this date, no consensus exists that would indicate the yearly revenue necessary to "be out of poverty", which means an income that would permit a person or a family to have the means, the choice and the necessary power to exercise all of its rights.

Getting out of poverty should permit a person to organize his personal and social life in such a way that he can live up to his various aspirations.

Nevertheless, from among the different indicators that measure poverty, several converge. They indicate a low income cut-off area, for 2013 between \$19 774 and \$22 199 (after taxes).

Getting out of poverty, according to one's personal situation, would possibly mean attain a point situated somewhere in this range.




Lighten up and illuminate the right way

To save energy, Montreal has decided to replace the light fixtures of 132 000 lamps on its territory. The LED at 4000 degrees K (Kelvin: 0 degreeK = -273 degree C) were a good thing. Effectively, compared to the present lamps (high sodium pressure) the energy saving would be around 50%. But there again, this type of LED has the disadvantage of emitting more blue light compared to high sodium pressure. White light created by the LED is the result of a combination of several types of wave lengths. However, the blue component is much stronger. This is what would make it potentially dangerous:

The two figures below show what has been noted:

Light under high sodium pressure





Following the intention of the Montreal authorities to proceed with this type of LED, there was a reaction from several people, pointing out their undesirable effects.

Serious studies have shown that the intrusive night light may cause sleep problems, thus promoting obesity, diabetes, and a reduction in the efficacy of the immune system. Negative effects have also been noted on animal health and flora.


All this is perfectly plausible since, for thousands of years, human beings, animals and plants have always lived in harmony with the natural cycles of nature, without artifice, i.e. skies that are not artificially lit.

After consideration of the potentially harmful effects when using the LED at 4000K degrees, the Coderre administration has opted for the LED at 3000K degree.



The criteria that have led the administration to come to this decision are: Ambiance – Environment – Quality of life – Health – Security.

When referring to the numbers in question (3000 degreeK vs. 4000degreeK) you can see the difference in the color:



These are not only the LED lamps that can cause problems. For a few years now, cars also have been equipped with blue headlights. On occasion, they may present a real danger for the driver coming from the opposite direction.

In fact, these headlights have become so popular with drivers that the companies have rushed to offer light bulbs in a deeper blue, which are contra-indicated for cars that do not have the specifications required.

In fact, this type of headlight should only be used for lenticular headlights which focus the beam in such a way as to avoid the glare.
