I would like to tell you how to register online for access to the SSQ Insurance which you can find described on the AREQ site under the SERVICES tab. If you are interested, I invite you to try it out.

There are four steps to registering online for access to our Collective Insurance plan (ASSUREQ).

You need to have your insurance card and your group insurance certificate on hand. If you do not have one or both of these documents, the client services of the SSQ will be pleased to help you by calling 1-888-833-6962.

Go to the SSQ site at ssq.ca and click on **LOGIN** at the top right-hand side of the page. Then click on **Group Insurance - ACCESS | Plan Members.** Since you are a new user, click **SIGN UP NOW.**

- 1. Enter your personal information and click **NEXT** to continue. Don't forget to make a note of your username and password. You'll need them later. Click **NEXT.**
- 2. Now it's time to enter your certificate number. It is printed on your SSQ insurance card and insurance certificate. Click **NEXT.**
- To finish your registration, enter the activation key printed on your group insurance certificate (at the bottom in the section titled *Steps to Register for Accès-assurés.*) Click on "I have read and accept the conditions of usage and confidentiality". Then click NEXT to confirm your registration.
- 4. Once all the steps are complete, you will receive an email from SSQ Financial Group with a link that must be clicked to confirm your registration. Please ensure that the information you provided is correct and click on ACCESS YOUR FILE. You will then be redirected to the ACCESS | Plan Members website.

Your registration for the **ACCESS** | **Plan Members** website is complete. From now on, you can log in by entering your username and password in the Existing User section on the left.

How to obtain a statement for tax purposes

First of all, go to the SSQ site at ssq.ca. Click on **LOGIN**, then click on **Group Insurance - ACCESS | Plan Members.** Enter your username and password. Once you are at the welcome page, in the quick links at the top of the page under **documents**, choose Statement for Tax Purposes. Either select a year or a specific time period and click on SUBMIT. Once you check the box next to the statement "I understand that some of the amounts set out in the statement may not be eligible for the tax credit for medical expenses and that it is my responsibility to ensure their eligibility" you can click the Print and Save button. You can also press the View detailed statement button and at the bottom of the page choose Print details. This will bring up another webpage which you can print.

Statement of Premiums

It is also possible to claim the amount of premiums paid in your Income Tax Return. If you are retired, you will find this amount on the statements issued by Retraite Québec. For retirees who are billed for their premiums (rather than using deduction at source) or who pay their premiums by pre-authorized payment, a tax receipt will be issued to you automatically by SSQ.

Travel Insurance - Cancellations

If you had planned a trip with a companion who is unable to make the trip and has to cancel, you can get a reimbursement of your trip from SSQ.

Also, trip cancellation is possible within Quebec if your trip is more than 200KM from your home and is for more than a two-night stay.

This year the average rent increase is from 0.5% to 1.9%.

The Régie du logement du Québec has published a tool on its website to calculate the rent increase. This gives renters and landlords a way to negotiate a fair increase in rent.

The increases for this year are as follows:

0.5% for an unheated apartment

0.5% for an apartment heated by electricity

0.7% for an apartment heated by gas

1.9% for an apartment heated by oil

Note that these increases do not take into consideration any amounts for increases in taxes or for renovations and repairs.

SOCIETY PROJECT BIOMETHANISATION

Since the beginning of time, humans have always produced organic waste. In the most distant past, the most common way to get rid of if was to let it rot on the surface of the earth or to disseminate it in the waterways. More recently, the most common way is to bury this waste in the earth in order to avoid the risk of harm to our quality of life and the environment.

To do this, it will, with time, cause air and water pollution (the lixiviat). These enormous quantities of buried putrescible material produce methane in industrial quantities since they stagnate in anaerobic environments.(in the absence of air).

However, methane gas (CH4) is much more polluting than carbon dioxide (CO2). Its concentration in the atmosphere is currently more than 2.5 times greater than in mid-18th century. Obviously, there are several natural sources of methane production. However, the production of anthropic methane (result of human activity) contributes nowadays to more than 20% in the context of climate changes. Not acceptable, you will say.

This awareness brought the City of Montreal in 1996 to take concrete measures to reduce the harmful effects of the gaz production on its territory. I will mention Gasmont center, located in the environmental complex of St. Michel (Miron quarry) which converts biogaz into electricity, drawn from the accumulation of waste (about 40 millions of tons).for more than 30 years.

The Government of Quebec, noting the magnitude of the management problem of the organic putrescible matters, has decided to completely eliminate landfill by the years 2020-2022 in order to respect international objectives (COP21) concerning the reduction of the GES (reduction of greenhouse gazes).

Accordingly, with the help of government contributions, the municipalities committed themselves to take on this company project which bears the name biomethanisation. This technique consists of decomposing the organic matter in

a closed environment (absence of oxygen) and recuperate the methane as a source of completely renewable green energy. Once the process of methanisation is terminated, what's left over if transformed, after certain handling, into potting soil.

Note that the City of St-Hyacinthe becomes one of the first cities to produce biogaz. Montreal, meanwhile, undertook already 6 years ago the planning and construction of four treatment centres of organic waste. End of work and marketing around 2020 - 2022.



Reading Magazines and Reviews Online with Your Tablet

If you are trying to find an article in a magazine, you can do it by using your tablet.

First of all, you will need to sign up on your local library's website with a client number and password. Next you need to install the RBdigital application on your tablet with the same email address as your local library but with another password.

Here is an example of an article on home automation found on page 25 of the *Protegez-vous* magazine at the Dollard-des-Ormeaux library site:

- Open the public library site: e.g.<u>http://webopac.ddo.qc.ca/iguana/www.main.cls?sURL=Accueil</u>
- 2. In **Explore**, choose **newspapers and magazines**
- 3. Click on Eureka.cc
- 4. Fill in your client number from your local library and your password
- 5. Choose **PDF SPACE** and fill in the date of the publication e.g. October 1, 2015 in the window that appears.
- 6. Choose the first letter of the name of the magazine from the alphabetical list e.g. "P"

- 7. Icons from various magazines beginning with P will appear, click on *Protegez-vous*
- 8. In the top left-hand corner, indicate the page number, e.g. page 25, "Les appareils domotiques"

You can find other reviews and magazines on the website of the *Bibliotèque nationale du Québec* (www.banq.qc.ca). All you need to do is register and you will receive a client number and password.

This is an extraordinary tool to explore!
